Preservation and Protection of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Lake

Executive Summary

We look to conserve, preserve and protect the surface waters known as the Concho Springs, Concho Creek, and Concho Lake. By Decree, Concho Water Company and its shareholders have exclusive rights to the waters of the Concho Springs, Concho Creek and our reservoir, Concho Lake. The Concho Springs, located on the old Concho Valley Country Club golf course, bubbles up from the ground making them an artesian well or a fracture spring. Reportedly, the USGS recorded the flow of the springs at 1.3 cfs. However, we cannot find an accurate source of this information (perhaps the AWPf could help us with this research). In the 1970's and 1980's the springs produced so much water, Concho Lake could not handle the volume. Excess water was then stored in two smaller reservoirs, Kemp and Sunshine, both located downstream from the lake. Once those also filled, the water then ran continuously, eventually meeting up with the Little Colorado river.

Up until the beginning of the summer of 2023, it was the consensus of the shareholders that the springs were drying up. The springs appeared to be producing hardly any water and the water level of our reservoir, the Concho Lake, was lower in April of 2023 than it ever had been, according to long standing residents. To supplement the assumed drying up of the springs, there were discussions of drilling wells into the Coconino aquifer. However, through the help and donation of a shareholder who owns a grading and excavating company, the springs were properly cleaned resulting in a much larger output. The Concho Spring is currently producing 1.2 cfs or almost 540 gpm (measured with a 12-inch throat Parshall Flume on July 3, 2023). We believe with a little more effort; the springs have the capability of producing even more surface water. Our goal would be to build a French Drain system over the springs to protect them from the environment.

The Concho Creek, which the spring feeds, begins, and runs through the old Concho Valley Golf Club golf course. This stretch of the creek has been over excavated in previous cleaning operations and mismanaged by various property owners of the land (Concho Water Company does not own any land). With only .08% fall the water sits stagnant, causing leaching and evaporation. After leaving the old golf course, the water continues downstream on a minimal sloped path with lots of partial blockage to Concho Lake. The Concho spring feeds a reservoir called Concho Lake.

Concho Lake is approximately 60 acres in size with a maximum depth of 16 feet and an average depth of 6 feet. The Arizona Game and Fish Department owns most of the land the lake is on. If the lake has a reasonable amount of water the AZGFD will stock it with catchable-sized rainbow trout, green sunfish and sometimes largemouth bass. In the past the lake would get drawn down during irrigation season (mid-April through the end of September) and was then filled up again through the autumn and winter.

Preservation and Protection of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Lake

Project Overview

Background

By Decree dated 1930, Concho Water Company and its shareholders have exclusive rights to the waters of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and water held in reserve in the Concho Lake. The Concho Springs, located on the old Concho Valley Country Club golf course, bubble up from the ground making them an artesian well or a fracture spring. Reportedly, the USGS recorded the flow of the springs at 1.3 cfs. However, we cannot find an accurate source of this information (perhaps the AAFP could help us with this research). In the 1970's and 1980's the springs produced so much water, Concho Lake could not handle the volume. Excess water was then stored in two smaller reservoirs, Kemp and Sunshine, both located downstream from the lake. Once those also filled, the water then ran continuously to eventually meet up with the Little Colorado river.

Up until the beginning of the summer of 2023, it was the consensus of the shareholders that the springs were drying up. The springs appeared to be producing hardly any water and the water level of our reservoir, the Concho Lake, was lower in April of 2023 than it ever had been, according to long standing residents. To supplement the assumed drying up of the springs, there were discussions of drilling wells into the Coconino aquifer. However, through the help and donation of a shareholder who owns a grading and excavating company the springs were properly cleaned resulting in a much larger output. The Concho Spring is currently producing 1.2 cfs or almost 540 gpm (measured with a 12-inch throat Parshall Flume on July 3, 2023). We believe with a little more effort; the springs have the capability of producing even more surface water.

Concho was originally settled in the early to mid-1770's by farmers and ranchers because of the very Spring we are trying to conserve. It is the oldest continuously lived-in community in the White Mountains and was the original site for the State Capital, due to its prosperous agricultural and livestock industry. The unincorporated town of Concho is made up of Concho Valley and Old Concho. As of the 2010 census, Old Concho had a population of 38 full time residents. Combining this with Concho Valley brings the total population to approximately 1,500 to 2,000 full and part time residents. Unfortunately, it is the community with the lowest average income in Apache County, which itself has the lowest average income in Arizona. This makes it difficult to come up with funds to conserve our precious water sources.

Goals

We, the Concho Water Company of Concho, AZ a non-profit Corp. established in 1941, look to conserve, preserve, and protect the surface waters known as the Concho Springs, Concho Creek, and Concho Lake.

Objectives

Our objective is for Concho Arizona to be the rich oasis in the high desert plains it once was, full of all types wildlife. The agricultural industry will thrive once again in Concho. Ready access to more water

means more grass, which gives a small rancher the ability to buy and sustain more livestock. Which then results in an increased income that can be spent boosting the local economy. Small farmers can once again grow green chili, beans, and corn that used to be in abundance in Concho. With this water conservation effort, orchards could be planted, and fruit sold again. Filling Concho Lake will see the return of migratory birds and aquatic wildlife that will result in a recreational paradise, drawing in naturalists, campers, and fisherman providing a tourism boost for local businesses who so desperately need it.

Statement of Problems/Causes

- A. The Concho Springs are situated in a low-lying area where they are subject to getting plugged up, mainly by erosion run-off.
- B. Concho Creek, from its origin at the Concho Springs to the Concho Lake Reservoir, has less than 0.1% fall. This stretch of the creek has been over excavated in previous cleaning operations and mismanaged by various property owners of the land causing excessive amounts of leaching and evaporation. During warmer months the water is stagnant, and the creek is overtaken by algae and cat tails. ***(Concho Water Company does not own any land)***
- C. Concho Lake is approximately 60 acres in size with a maximum depth of 16 feet and an average depth of 6 feet. The Arizona Game and Fish Department owns most of the land the lake is on. If the lake has a reasonable amount of water the AZGFD will stock it with catchable-sized rainbow trout, green sunfish, and sometimes largemouth bass. In the past the lake would get drawn down during irrigation season (mid-April through the end of September) and was then filled up again by the springs through autumn and winter. However, this has not been the case for about 25 years. What used to be the level of the lake at the end of irrigation season, is now the level at the beginning of the season. In recent years, there has only been enough water reserved to water some orchards. Irrigating pastures has been out of the question.

Statement of Solutions

- A. Maximize the water generated by the Concho Springs and construct a French drainage system over them. This will protect the Concho Springs from getting plugged by debris caused by erosion run-off.
- B. Pipe alongside Concho Creek from the springs through the old golf course, +/- 2,450 feet, then from the old golf course to the reservoir known as Concho Lake, +/- 900 feet. This will allow us TO run water through a pipe during the dormant months conserving millions of gallons of water currently lost to leaching and evaporation. While the water runs through pipes, this will allow us the opportunity to dewater this stretch of the creek, fix past efforts, and reconstruct the creek so it flows unencumbered. It is important to the environment, the community and the current landowner that there always be a flowing creek.
- C. Bypass the lake, +/- 5,100 feet, with Pipe. This will allow serviceable shareholders of the Concho Water Company to irrigate without drawing down the lake significantly. AZGFD can plan to stock the lake with fish.

Statement of Project Years of Benefit to the Resource and General Public

The total duration of this project is approximately 12 months. Once the new infrastructure is in place it can last indefinitely with regular preventive maintenance allowing for:

- Greener pastures
- Healthier livestock
- More orchards and gardens
- Return of a local farmers market
- Increased volume in Concho Lake
- Return of migratory birds and Bald Eagles
- Increased aquatic wildlife.
- Increased tourism
- Increased commerce such as retail and supply
- Higher property values

In summary, water is life and life giving. Conserving Concho Springs water brings multiple benefits, ranging from ensuring a sustainable water supply and protecting ecosystems to promoting economic savings and climate resilience. These advantages underscore the importance of responsible water management and the need for collective efforts to protect and preserve this valuable natural resource.

Preservation of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Lake Reservoir Scope of Work

TASK # 1

Task Title

French Drain System over Concho Springs.

Task Description

Maximize the water generated by the Concho Springs and protect them by constructing a French drainage system over the top of them.

Task Purpose/Objective

To capture all the available water and protect the Concho Springs from getting plugged by debris caused by erosion run-off.

Deliverable Description

The first two days will be spent doing a little more excavation to unearth as many springs as possible. Once all the springs have been exposed, we will place rows of 6-inch perforated pipe without spacing over the top of the entire area (3,900 sf). Leach rock (local cinder rock) 1 to-3-inch in diameter, will be placed 1-foot thick over the top of the perforated pipe using a long reach piece of equipment called a Gradall. A non-woven geofabric will be placed over the rock, and then backfilled with soil.

Two weeks after the start date.

TASK # 2**Task Title**

Auxiliary Pipeline alongside Concho Creek from Springs to Lake

Task Description

Pipe alongside Concho Creek from the springs through the old golf course, +/- 2,450 feet, then from the old golf course to the reservoir known as Concho Lake, +/- 900 feet.

Task Purpose/Objective

Divert the water from the creek to a pipe alongside the creek during the dormant months conserving millions of gallons of water currently lost to leaching and evaporation.

Deliverable Description

Excavate, lay, and backfill pipe alongside Concho Creek. Install a headgate in the creek to divert water from the creek to the pipe.

Deliverable Due Date

Five weeks after start date

TASK # 3

Task Title

Dewater and re-grade existing creek bed to create unimpeded flow.

Task Description

While the water runs through the auxiliary pipe during the dormant season, the creek will be dewatered in areas of standing water allowing construction to uniformly grade the creek, so it flows unencumbered from its source, Concho Springs, to the reservoir, Concho Lake.

Task Purpose/Objective

An unencumbered flow will prevent the water from becoming stagnant and overgrown with cattails resulting in a pristine creek. It is important to the environment, Concho Water Company, the Concho community, and the current landowner that there always be a flowing creek.

Deliverable Description

Most of the creek will drain itself dry. In deeper areas of the creek, mainly on the old golf course, 6-inch pumps will be used to pump water out. There will be a drying out period before re-grading the creek can begin. Once the creek has dried, it will be surveyed and staked to establish an even slope. A grading contractor will use heavy equipment to cut and fill parts of the creek. If additional soil is needed, the property owner has identified a borrow are on property.

Deliverable Due Date

Two weeks to complete the dewatering operation, one month to dry out and four weeks to re-grade the creek.

TASK # 4**Task Title**

Auxiliary Pipeline alongside Concho Lake

Task Description

Bypass the lake with approximately 5,100 feet of pipe.

Task Purpose/Objective

For shareholders of the Concho Water Company to irrigate without drawing down the lake significantly, keeping the lake fuller. AZGFD and the ANRCS are in full cooperation with this plan.

Deliverable Description

Install a headgate in the creek just above the lake to divert water from the creek to the pipe. Excavate, lay, and backfill pipe alongside Concho Lake to an existing pipe that already runs through the dam.

Deliverable Due Date

Six and a half weeks after the start date.

WHEREAS, the above entitled matter was heard heretofore before the Honorable Frank P. Trott, Water Commissioner, for the State of Arizona, on Monday, the 14th. day of May, 1928 in the M. A. Candalaria Store, at and in Concho, Apache County, Arizona; and,

WHEREAS, the said Water Commissioner heard all the evidence of the interested parties, and had said evidence taken down in shorthand and typewritten and filed with the Clerk of this Court; and,

WHEREAS, the said Water Commissioner did make findings of fact from said evidence, and in accordance with said findings of fact did make awards to the various interested parties of said Concho Springs and Concho Creek and did file the same with the Clerk of this Court; and,

WHEREAS, when the matter came on for final hearing in this Court, none of the claimants of the waters of the Concho Springs and Concho Creek, appeared and filed exceptions to the findings and awards made by the said Water Commissioner and filed as aforesaid;


IT WAS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, that the said findings of fact and awards of the said Water Commissioner filed with the Clerk of this Court as aforesaid be in all respects approved and confirmed, and that the same be and remain in full force and effect until the further judgment or order of this Court, changing or modifying the same, in the manner and as allowed by law, and,



Now, on this, the 3rd day of November, 1928, the above entitled matter having been regularly initiated upon petition of E. B. Candelaria, Anna M. Ortega, Clara C. Miraval, Santos Candelaria, Juan Candelaria, Evaristo Martinez, Clara C. Ortega, E. D. Ortega, Candido Sandoval, J. M. Sandoval, J. P. Sandoval, Lorenzo Baca, Ramon Ortiz, Manuel Gallego, and Trancito Garcia, all of Concho, Arizona, and the facts and conditions having been investigated by the Commissioner and found to justify a determination; notice having been given to all claimants that at a designated time and place the Commissioner would begin an investigation of the flow of the stream and ditches diverting water therefrom, and the land irrigated thereby, such notice stating that all claimants would be required to make proof of their claims when called upon by the Commissioner; full investigation having been made, and testimony and proof of all claimants and witnesses having been taken; and, upon completion of taking of testimony, notice having been given to all claimants that all of said evidence would be open to public inspection at a designated time and place, and all of said evidence having been open to public inspection at the place and for the time specified in said notice, and five days having elapsed and no contest having been filed, the Commissioner, being fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in his office his Findings of Fact and Order of Determination as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT.

I.

That, on the twelfth day of March, 1927, there was filed in the office of the State Water Commissioner a petition signed by R. B. Candelaria, Anna M. Ortega, Clara C. Miraval, Santos Candelaria, Juan Candelaria, Evaristo Martinez, Clara C. Ortega, E. D. Ortega, Candido Sandoval, J. M. Sandoval, J. P. Sandoval, Lorenzo Baca, Ramon Ortiz, Manuel Gallegos and Trancito Garcia, praying for a Determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Concho Springs and Concho Creek; that the petitioners are owners of land within the State of Arizona, and are users of the waters of the said Concho Springs and Concho Creek; that, after due investigation, the Commissioner found the facts and conditions to be such as to justify making a Determination of said rights.

II.

Therefore, a Notice was prepared by the Commissioner, setting forth the day when he would begin an examination of the said spring and creek, and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the day when, and the place where, he would begin the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said spring and stream; that said notice was published in two successive issues of the St. Johns Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation published in St. Johns, Apache County, Arizona, said issues being published on the 26th day of April and 3rd day of May, 1928, respectively, and the date of the last publication being more than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for the making of said examination of said spring and stream, and for the beginning of the taking of testimony by the Commissioner.

III.

That, on the 13th day of April, 1928, the Commissioner caused to be sent by registered mail to each person, owner, firm, corporation, or municipality, claiming a right to the use of the waters of said spring and

stream, insofar as said claimants, owners, firm, corporation, or municipality could be reasonably ascertained, a similar notice setting forth the date when the Commissioner would begin the examination of the spring and stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the date when he would begin the taking of testimony as to the rights to the use of the waters of said spring and stream; that the Commissioner enclosed with said notice a blank form prepared by him, on which the claimants or owners, firm, corporation, or municipality themselves, or their duly authorized agent, should present in writing all the particulars necessary for the Determination of his, their or its right to the use of the waters of said stream as aforesaid; that due proof of the publication of said notice and the service of said notice by registered mail have been made and duly filed as a part of the record hereof.

IV.

That at the time specified in said notice the Commissioner did proceed to make an examination of said spring and stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and of the lands irrigated and susceptible of irrigation thereby; that observations and measurements were obtained; that the Commissioner caused to be made a survey of the said spring, stream, and ditches diverting water therefrom, and maps obtained from said survey have been filed, and are now on file and of record, in the office of the Commissioner as a part of the record hereof.

V.

That, at the time and place specified in said notice, to-wit: at M. A. Candelaria's Store, in Concho, Arizona, on Monday, the 14th day of May, 1928, at 9:00 o'clock A. M., a meeting was held for the purpose of taking testimony in support of claims of claimants; that thereafter there was filed with the Commissioner statement and proof of claimant by each and every owner, person, firm, corporation and municipality claiming a right to the use of the waters of said spring and creek as aforesaid, which statements and proof of claimants have been made a part of the record hereof.

VI.

That, upon the completion of the taking of testimony, the Commissioner did, thereafter, on the 30th day of June, 1928, give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said spring and creek as aforesaid, that all of the statements and proofs of claimants, and all oral evidence reduced to writing, and all documentary evidence submitted, together with all maps prepared at the request of the Commissioner, would be open to inspection by the various claimants at the time and place mentioned in said notice, to-wit: beginning on Monday, the 9th day of July, 1928, and ending on Saturday, the 11th day of August, 1928, (Sundays excepted) from 9:00 to 12:00 o'clock A. M. and from 2:00 to 5:00 o'clock P. M., at the Postoffice in Concho, Arizona.

That the Commissioner did, in accordance with said notice, keep said statements and proof of claimants, and oral evidence reduced to writint, and all documentary evidence submitted, together with the maps prepared at the request of the Commissioner, open to inspection, at the time and place designated in said notice, for a period of thirty (30) days, Sundays excepted.

That said notice also set forth that, should any claimant desire to contest the claim of right of any other claimant or claimants who have submitted their evidence to the Commissioner, such claimant should, within five (5) days after the expiration of the date fixed for closing the inspection mentioned in said notice, file with the Commissioner a statement in writing setting forth with certainty the grounds of the proposed contest, and the name of the owner, persons, firm, corporation, or municipality, whose claim of right he desired to contest.

VII.

That no contests were filed, either within the five-day limitation provided by law, nor thereafter.

VIII.

That, to successfully and properly irrigate land, a sufficient head

of water should be used; that the amount of water for the head will depend upon the acreage to be irrigated, the slope of the ground and the character and physical condition of the soil; that three (3) acre feet of water per annum, measured at the point of use, is sufficient to properly irrigate an acre of land of the character, at the altitude, and in the location of the claimants' land herein; that a continuous flow of water is not necessary on the land, but that a proper system of rotation, varying in time from Schedule three to fifteen days, according to the character of the soil and kind of crops grown, is found to be the most economical and satisfactory method of use.

IX.

That all claimants to the right to use of water for irrigation purposes, whose rights are determined herein, shall be entitled to the use of water for stock and domestic purposes; that the right to use such water is hereby confirmed and entitled the owner of such water right to divert and use such a quantity of water as is reasonably necessary for his household and stock use.

X.

That the rights to the use of water for irrigation purposes, as determined herein, are, and shall be, appurtenant to the lands herein described, and are limited and confirmed to the irrigation of such lands as are set forth and described herein; and the priorities herein confirmed confer no right to use the waters of said spring and creek, as aforesaid, on lands other than those specified herein as having rights appurtenant thereto, and each and every person, owner, firm, corporation, association or municipality shall be, and is hereby, prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using the waters of said stream on any other lands without first applying for and receiving a lawful permit from the State Water Commissioner so to do.

XI.

That in 1900, M. A. Candelaria built approximately one-half mile of

ditch for watering of 20,000 head of range stock, and in 1918, extended said ditch for a distance of approximately four miles, running through a small reservoir, with a capacity of four (4) acre feet, located in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 24, Township 13 North, Range 25 East; thence into Mail Station Wash, which is used as a carrier for a distance of twelve miles; that said ditch and Wash are used for the entire distance for stockwatering purposes; that N. A. Candelaria is entitled to the use of such amount of water as is reasonably necessary and proper for the purpose of watering 20,000 head of range stock as aforesaid.

XII.

That the order of rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of said spring and stream as aforesaid, and the order in which they are entitled to divert and use the said waters shall be, and is, according to the date of the relative priorities as herein set forth and determined; and the first in order of time, according to the date of relative priority, shall be, and is, first in order of right; and that the same order of right shall obtain down to the last appropriation, and those having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said spring and stream, without let or hindrance, when necessary for beneficial use for irrigation of their respective lands, or other beneficial purposes for which a right is established and decreed herein, as against those having subsequent rights; and when the water is not required by the appropriator having a prior right to its use for the purpose for which said water is appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down said stream, or down the canal or ditch, from which he takes or diverts the same without let or hindrance; and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of such water and may divert the same to the extent of their rights of appropriation, according to the order of their priority; and at all times the water diverted shall be beneficially, economically and reasonably used without waste; and no rights are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity

of water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose for which the water right is hereby established; and should there be surplus water, it shall be returned to the stream or canal from which the diversion was made, or delivered to another appropriator having and established right thereto. Nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to invalidate any agreements waiving priority of appropriation or use as between the parties to such agreement.

XIII.

That this Determination of Relative Rights to the use of the waters of Concho Spring and Concho Creek in Apache County, Arizona, is intended to, and does, include all rights existing on the 14th day of May, 1928.

XIV.

That the relative rights to the use of the waters of Concho Spring and Concho Creek, as herein determined, are set forth in the following tables arranged in tabulation form, first, by description of land, and second by year of priority, showing the name of the owner, person, firm, corporation or municipality in whom the right to the use of such water vests, together with the date of priority, a description of the land upon which the water is to be used, and the number of acres to which such appropriation is to be applied, and to which said use is limited, to-wit:

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
CONCHO WATER COMPANY

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Arizona, and in accordance with the laws of said state do hereby adopt the following ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION:

ARTICLE I.

The names of the persons forming this corporation are:
TULLY THOMAS, ROMAN CANDELARIA and C. F. McGUIRE.

ARTICLE II.

The name of this corporation is and shall be "CONCHO WATER COMPANY", and its principal place for the transaction of business shall be the town of Concho, in Apache County, Arizona.

ARTICLE III.

Section 1: The general nature of the business to be transacted by this corporation, and the object and purposes for the organization of this corporation, are as follows, to-wit: To acquire, construct and maintain an irrigation system, consisting of suitable canals, reservoirs, ditches, water gates, sluices and all other constructions and devices necessary for preserving, conveying and distributing the waters of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Reservoir to its stockholders, and to any other persons entitled thereto, according to law, and according to that certain Judgment and Decree entered in the Superior Court of the State of Arizona, in and for the County of Apache, on the 20th day of January, 1930, being Civil Cause No. 1521, and entitled: "In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Concho Springs and Concho Creek in Apache County, Arizona", for irrigation,

stock watering, domestic, power generation and municipal purposes.

Said corporation shall have power to acquire by lease, purchase, condemnation, or otherwise, such real property, easements, rights-of-way, water rights and any and all personal property which may be necessary or convenient to its corporate objects; to exchange the capital stock of this corporation for rights, privileges, easements, franchises, labor or services necessary or advantageous to its corporate objects; and to exchange the capital stock for capital stock of other corporations similarly engaged in the storing, conserving and distribution of water to its stockholders; to borrow money and to secure the payment of the same by mortgages or liens upon the property of the corporation. None of the objects and purposes above mentioned shall be considered in limitation or derogation of the general rights conferred by law upon corporations of this character; but this corporation shall have all the rights, benefits and privileges by law conferred upon corporations of like character, whether or not the same have been herein specifically set forth and described.

Section 2: The lands which are to be irrigated, as aforesaid, and the owners of said land to which the waters of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Reservoir are to be delivered, according to these Articles of Incorporation, shall be and is the land situated in Townships 12 and 13 North, Range 26 East of the Gila and Salt River Base & Meridian, Apache County, Arizona; and being primarily the same lands set out and adjudicated as the lands on which the water rights are decreed in that certain Judgment in the Superior Court of the State of Arizona, in and for the County of Apache, dated January 20, 1930, and being Civil Cause No. 1521 in said court, and being designated "In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Concho Springs and Concho Creek in Apache County, Arizona"; together with any other lands to which the decreed water rights of said Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Reservoir may have legally been transferred and

become appurtenant thereto.

ARTICLE IV.

Section 1: The capital stock of the corporation shall be One Thousand Seventy-four and Three tenths (1074.3) shares, which said shares shall become appurtenant one share to each acre, or a fractional share to each fractional acre of the land hereinbefore generally referred to, and particularly set forth and described in "Table No. 2", attached to and made a part and parcel of that certain Judgment entered in the Superior Court of the State of Arizona, in and for the County of Apache, dated January 20, 1930, and being Civil Cause No. 1521 in said court, and being designated: "In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Concho Springs and Concho Creek in Apache County, Arizona"; together with any other lands to which said decreed rights aforementioned may have been legally transferred and become appurtenant thereto. All of said shares shall be without par value and shall be fully paid.

Section 2: Only those persons who are owners of land subject to irrigation, as referred to and described by reference in Section 1 of this Article, may become the owners and holders of the shares of the capital stock of this corporation.

Section 3: The ownership of the shares of stock of this corporation shall carry as incident thereto the right to have delivered to them by the Corporation, for the irrigation of the lands to which said shares are appurtenant, 3-acre feet of water per acre per annum, so long as there is sufficient water available from said source for all of the acreage mentioned in Section 1 of this Article. In the event that there should be insufficient water for the furnishing of said total acreage with 3-acre feet per acre per annum, then and in that event, this corporation shall furnish 3-acre feet per acre per annum to the owners of the lands set forth in "Table No. 2" of said Civil Cause No. 1521, in the order of the dates of appropriation therein set forth, serving the oldest right or rights first, and continuing to serve each succeeding right, so far as said water will reach.

Section 4: The records of the corporation and each and every Certificate of Stock or other evidence of ownership of shares of stock in the corporation when issued shall contain a description of the lands to be irrigated and to which the aforesaid rights and shares shall be perpetually appurtenant; and thereafter all rights from whatever source or whatever manner of acquisition, to the use of water for the irrigation of said lands, shall forever be appurtenant to said lands, together with said shares of stock, and all rights and interest represented thereby, unless such rights shall have been forfeited by operation of law or by the voluntary abandonment thereof, or by deed, grant or other instrument, or by non-use for the time prescribed by law, but no such abandonment shall be for the benefit of any person designated by such share-holder, directly or indirectly, or to his use; nor shall such abandonment confer any right whatever upon the holder of any grant, release, waiver or declaration of abandonment; provided, however, that if for any reason it shall at any time become impracticable to beneficially use water for the irrigation of the lands to which the right to use of the same is appurtenant, said right may be severed from said land and transferred and become appurtenant to other lands to which the shares of stock of this corporation shall thereafter and thereby become appurtenant to, and in conformity with the provisions of law in such cases made and provided. Upon proper petition duly filed and presented, pursuant to law, for leave to make such a transfer, and upon proper order made authorizing such transfer, a new Certificate of Stock shall be issued by the proper officers of this corporation, upon the surrender of the old certificate appurtenant to the land from which the water right is transferred. Said new certificate shall contain a description of the land to be irrigated and to which said Certificate of Stock, and all rights and privileges incident thereto, shall thereafter become appurtenant.

Section 5: Every transfer of the title to any land to which said water rights and stock are so appurtenant, whether by grant or by operation of law, shall operate, whether or not it be so expressed in the grant or other means of transfer, as a transfer of all rights to the use of water for irrigation of said land, and all rights arising from or incident to the ownership of such stock to the grantee and his successors in title to such land, and upon presentation to the proper officer of this corporation proof of the transfer of said land to which such water rights and stock is appurtenant, such stock shall be transferred upon the books of the corporation to the successor in title to the saidlands.

Section 6: Any transfer or attempted transfer of any of the shares of the stock of this corporation made or suffered by the owner thereof, unless simultaneously a transfer of land to which it is appurtenant is made or suffered shall be of no force or effect whatever for any purpose, and shall confer no rights of any kind whatever on the person or persons to whom such transfer may have been made.

Section 7: The term of existence of this corporation shall commence on the date of the filing of these Articles of Incorporation for record with the Corporation Commission of the State of Arizona, and the issuance of authority to transact business, and shall continue thereafter for a period of twenty-five (25) years.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1: The management of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5), as may be fixed by the By-laws of this Corporation. The Board of Directors shall be elected annually at a meeting of the stockholders, to be held at Concho, Apache County, Arizona, on the first Saturday in the month of March, at the hour of 5:00 o'clock p.m. Until the first annual election, and until their successors are elected and qualified, the Board of Directors of said corporation shall be comprised of the following

persons: TULLY THOMAS, ROMAN CANDELARIA and E. C. McGUIRE.

Section 2: The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held immediately following the annual meeting of the stockholders and at the same place. Executive officers of this corporation shall be: A President, Vice-president and Secretary and Treasurer. Said officers shall be elected annually from among their own body at the annual meeting by the Board of Directors. Until the first annual election, and until their successors are elected and qualified, the executive officers of this corporation shall be the following persons:

President, TULLY THOMAS,
Vice-president, ROMAN CANDELARIA,
Secretary-Treasurer, C. F. McGUIRE.

The Board of Directors shall have power to fill any vacancies in the Board of Directors or any other office of the Corporation.

Section 3: The salaries or other compensation of the Directors and officers of the Corporation shall be fixed by the Board of Directors at their annual meetings.

ARTICLE VI.

In furtherance, and not in limitation, of the powers conferred by law, the Board of Directors are expressly authorized:

Section 1: To make, alter, amend or repeal the By-laws of the Corporation.

Section 2: To fill any vacancies occurring in the Board of Directors or in any other office of the Corporation.

Section 3: To levy and collect all needful and necessary assessments and charges for service against the stockholders of this Corporation, and to enforce the same pursuant to the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation.

Section 4: To make all needful rules and regulations for the equitable, economic and proper use and distribution of the waters of Concho Springs, Concho Creek and Concho Reservoir, and to pro-rate the same

among the stockholders of this Corporation in accordance with the law and the provisions of these Articles.

ARTICLE VII.

Section 1: The revenue necessary for the accomplishment of the purposes as outlined in these Articles of Incorporation shall be derived as follows:

FIRST: From income arising from the sale, lease or otherwise furnishing of electric or other power or power privileges, and from the delivery of water for irrigation and municipal purposes.

SECOND: From Assessments made against the stock and stockholders of this Corporation so far as they may be from time to time necessary for cost of construction, employment, enlargement, repair, operation and maintenance of the irrigation system and other works of this Corporation.

Section 2: The Board of Directors shall, at its annual meeting on the first Saturday in March of each year, or at such other time annually as may be fixed by the By-laws, determine the probable costs of care, operation, maintenance, repair and enlargement of the irrigation system of the Corporation for the next ensuing irrigation season, including therein any deficits otherwise unprovided for, and shall also at the same time estimate the probable net income of the Corporation from all sources other than that which may be derived from the delivery of water to its shareholders, if any. From such estimate costs there shall be deducted the estimate net income, and upon this difference shall be computed the charge to be made to shareholders for the service of delivering irrigation water for said year. The total balance, after deducting the amount estimated to be received from all sources other than that which may be derived from the service of delivering water to its shareholders, shall be obtained by an assessment upon each share of the Corporation stock, as the same may bear to the whole amount necessary to be raised

for operation for the ensuing year. Such assessment shall become due and payable on or before the 15th day of April next ensuing the levy, or at such other time or times as may be fixed in the By-laws. The assessment against said stock shall be paid in advance of delivery of any water, and the Board of Directors shall instruct its officers, agents and employees to refuse to deliver any water until said assessment is paid.

Section 3: Assessments against the stock of this Corporation, from time to time as they are made and levied and until they are paid or otherwise discharged, shall be and remain a lien on the land of the shareholders against which they are levied, and to which said shares of stock are appurtenant. The manner of fixing the lien and enforcing the same shall be prescribed in the By-laws. In addition to such provisions, the Corporation may enforce the payment of assessments by suit therefor against the owner of the shares in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 4: The Board of Directors shall each year determine whether or not it shall deliver water to the owners of land having water rights appurtenant thereto, who are not shareholders of this Corporation, and shall fix and determine the charges to be paid by said land owners.

ARTICLE VIII.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this Corporation may at any time subject itself is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars, and the private property of the stockholders thereof shall never be liable for the debts of the Corporation.





Now, on this, the 3rd day of November, 1928, the above entitled matter having been regularly initiated upon petition of E. B. Candelaria, Anna M. Ortega, Clara C. Miraval, Santos Candelaria, Juan Candelaria, Evaristo Martinez, Clara C. Ortega, E. D. Ortega, Candido Sandoval, J. M. Sandoval, J. P. Sandoval, Lorenzo Baca, Ramon Ortiz, Manuel Gallego, and Trancito Garcia, all of Concho, Arizona, and the facts and conditions having been investigated by the Commissioner and found to justify a determination; notice having been given to all claimants that at a designated time and place the Commissioner would begin an investigation of the flow of the stream and ditches diverting water therefrom, and the land irrigated thereby, such notice stating that all claimants would be required to make proof of their claims when called upon by the Commissioner; full investigation having been made, and testimony and proof of all claimants and witnesses having been taken; and, upon completion of taking of testimony, notice having been given to all claimants that all of said evidence would be open to public inspection at a designated time and place, and all of said evidence having been open to public inspection at the place and for the time specified in said notice, and five days having elapsed and no contest having been filed, the Commissioner, being fully advised in the premises, makes and orders to be entered of record in his office his Findings of Fact and Order of Determination as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT.

I.

That, on the twelfth day of March, 1927, there was filed in the office of the State Water Commissioner a petition signed by R. B. Candelaria, Anna M. Ortega, Clara C. Miraval, Santos Candelaria, Juan Candelaria, Evaristo Martinez, Clara C. Ortega, E. D. Ortega, Candido Sandoval, J. M. Sandoval, J. P. Sandoval, Lorenzo Baca, Ramon Ortiz, Manuel Gallegos and Trancito Garcia, praying for a Determination of the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of Concho Springs and Concho Creek; that the petitioners are owners of land within the State of Arizona, and are users of the waters of the said Concho Springs and Concho Creek; that, after due investigation, the Commissioner found the facts and conditions to be such as to justify making a Determination of said rights.

II.

Therefore, a Notice was prepared by the Commissioner, setting forth the day when he would begin an examination of the said spring and creek, and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the day when, and the place where, he would begin the taking of testimony as to the relative rights of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said spring and stream; that said notice was published in two successive issues of the St. Johns Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation published in St. Johns, Apache County, Arizona, said issues being published on the 26th day of April and 3rd day of May, 1928, respectively, and the date of the last publication being more than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for the making of said examination of said spring and stream, and for the beginning of the taking of testimony by the Commissioner.

III.

That, on the 13th day of April, 1928, the Commissioner caused to be sent by registered mail to each person, owner, firm, corporation, or municipality, claiming a right to the use of the waters of said spring and

stream, insofar as said claimants, owners, firm, corporation, or municipality could be reasonably ascertained, a similar notice setting forth the date when the Commissioner would begin the examination of the spring and stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and the date when he would begin the taking of testimony as to the rights to the use of the waters of said spring and stream; that the Commissioner enclosed with said notice a blank form prepared by him, on which the claimants or owners, firm, corporation, or municipality themselves, or their duly authorized agent, should present in writing all the particulars necessary for the Determination of his, their or its right to the use of the waters of said stream as aforesaid; that due proof of the publication of said notice and the service of said notice by registered mail have been made and duly filed as a part of the record hereof.

IV.

That at the time specified in said notice the Commissioner did proceed to make an examination of said spring and stream and the ditches diverting water therefrom, and of the lands irrigated and susceptible of irrigation thereby; that observations and measurements were obtained; that the Commissioner caused to be made a survey of the said spring, stream, and ditches diverting water therefrom, and maps obtained from said survey have been filed, and are now on file and of record, in the office of the Commissioner as a part of the record hereof.

V.

That, at the time and place specified in said notice, to-wit: at M. A. Candelaria's Store, in Concho, Arizona, on Monday, the 14th day of May, 1928, at 9:00 o'clock A. M., a meeting was held for the purpose of taking testimony in support of claims of claimants; that thereafter there was filed with the Commissioner statement and proof of claimant by each and every owner, person, firm, corporation and municipality claiming a right to the use of the waters of said spring and creek as aforesaid, which statements and proof of claimants have been made a part of the record hereof.

VI.

That, upon the completion of the taking of testimony, the Commissioner did, thereafter, on the 30th day of June, 1928, give notice by registered mail to each of the various claimants to the use of the waters of said spring and creek as aforesaid, that all of the statements and proofs of claimants, and all oral evidence reduced to writing, and all documentary evidence submitted, together with all maps prepared at the request of the Commissioner, would be open to inspection by the various claimants at the time and place mentioned in said notice, to-wit: beginning on Monday, the 9th day of July, 1928, and ending on Saturday, the 11th day of August, 1928, (Sundays excepted) from 9:00 to 12:00 o'clock A. M. and from 2:00 to 5:00 o'clock P. M., at the Postoffice in Concho, Arizona.

That the Commissioner did, in accordance with said notice, keep said statements and proof of claimants, and oral evidence reduced to writint, and all documentary evidence submitted, together with the maps prepared at the request of the Commissioner, open to inspection, at the time and place designated in said notice, for a period of thirty (30) days, Sundays excepted.

That said notice also set forth that, should any claimant desire to contest the claim of right of any other claimant or claimants who have submitted their evidence to the Commissioner, such claimant should, within five (5) days after the expiration of the date fixed for closing the inspection mentioned in said notice, file with the Commissioner a statement in writing setting forth with certainty the grounds of the proposed contest, and the name of the owner, persons, firm, corporation, or municipality, whose claim of right he desired to contest.

VII.

That no contests were filed, either within the five-day limitation provided by law, nor thereafter.

VIII.

That, to successfully and properly irrigate land, a sufficient head

of water should be used; that the amount of water for the head will depend upon the acreage to be irrigated, the slope of the ground and the character and physical condition of the soil; that three (3) acre feet of water per annum, measured at the point of use, is sufficient to properly irrigate an acre of land of the character, at the altitude, and in the location of the claimants' land herein; that a continuous flow of water is not necessary on the land, but that a proper system of rotation, varying in time from Schedule three to fifteen days, according to the character of the soil and kind of crops grown, is found to be the most economical and satisfactory method of use.

IX.

That all claimants to the right to use of water for irrigation purposes, whose rights are determined herein, shall be entitled to the use of water for stock and domestic purposes; that the right to use such water is hereby confirmed and entitled the owner of such water right to divert and use such a quantity of water as is reasonably necessary for his household and stock use.

X.

That the rights to the use of water for irrigation purposes, as determined herein, are, and shall be, appurtenant to the lands herein described, and are limited and confirmed to the irrigation of such lands as are set forth and described herein; and the priorities herein confirmed confer no right to use the waters of said spring and creek, as aforesaid, on lands other than those specified herein as having rights appurtenant thereto, and each and every person, owner, firm, corporation, association or municipality shall be, and is hereby, prohibited, restrained and enjoined from diverting and using the waters of said stream on any other lands without first applying for and receiving a lawful permit from the State Water Commissioner so to do.

XI.

That in 1900, M. A. Candelaria built approximately one-half mile of

ditch for watering of 20,000 head of range stock, and in 1918, extended said ditch for a distance of approximately four miles, running through a small reservoir, with a capacity of four (4) acre feet, located in the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 24, Township 13 North, Range 25 East; thence into Mail Station Wash, which is used as a carrier for a distance of twelve miles; that said ditch and Wash are used for the entire distance for stockwatering purposes; that N. A. Candelaria is entitled to the use of such amount of water as is reasonably necessary and proper for the purpose of watering 20,000 head of range stock as aforesaid.

XII.

That the order of rights of the respective appropriators of the waters of said spring and stream as aforesaid, and the order in which they are entitled to divert and use the said waters shall be, and is, according to the date of the relative priorities as herein set forth and determined; and the first in order of time, according to the date of relative priority, shall be, and is, first in order of right; and that the same order of right shall obtain down to the last appropriation, and those having prior rights are entitled to divert and use the waters of said spring and stream, without let or hindrance, when necessary for beneficial use for irrigation of their respective lands, or other beneficial purposes for which a right is established and decreed herein, as against those having subsequent rights; and when the water is not required by the appropriator having a prior right to its use for the purpose for which said water is appropriated, he must and shall permit it to flow down said stream, or down the canal or ditch, from which he takes or diverts the same without let or hindrance; and those having subsequent rights are entitled to the use of such water and may divert the same to the extent of their rights of appropriation, according to the order of their priority; and at all times the water diverted shall be beneficially, economically and reasonably used without waste; and no rights are hereby confirmed to divert a greater quantity

of water than such appropriator can beneficially use for the purpose for which the water right is hereby established; and should there be surplus water, it shall be returned to the stream or canal from which the diversion was made, or delivered to another appropriator having and established right thereto. Nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to invalidate any agreements waiving priority of appropriation or use as between the parties to such agreement.

XIII.

That this Determination of Relative Rights to the use of the waters of Concho Spring and Concho Creek in Apache County, Arizona, is intended to, and does, include all rights existing on the 14th day of May, 1928.

XIV.

That the relative rights to the use of the waters of Concho Spring and Concho Creek, as herein determined, are set forth in the following tables arranged in tabulation form, first, by description of land, and second by year of priority, showing the name of the owner, person, firm, corporation or municipality in whom the right to the use of such water vests, together with the date of priority, a description of the land upon which the water is to be used, and the number of acres to which such appropriation is to be applied, and to which said use is limited, to-wit:

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, That the various claimants herein and their successors in interest be, and they are hereby, entitled to divert and to have diverted from the waters flowing from Concho Spring and in Concho Creek, in Apache County, Arizona, to and upon such land owned or possessed by them, as their rights may appear in the foregoing Findings of Fact, for beneficial use upon such land, such amount of water as may be necessary and proper for economical and successful irrigation and cultivation of such land, in area and extent, and in duration, and according to the relative rights of priority of appropriation, and in the amount, manner and form as shown, set forth and determined in the foregoing Findings of Fact of this date, and the tables annexed thereto, which Findings of Fact and accompanying tables are hereby made a part of, and are to be considered as incorporated in, this Determination, and to which reference is hereby made for exact and particular description and provision.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That this Order of Determination, and the provisions of the Findings of Fact herein, shall become effective on and after the 9th day of November, 1922.
